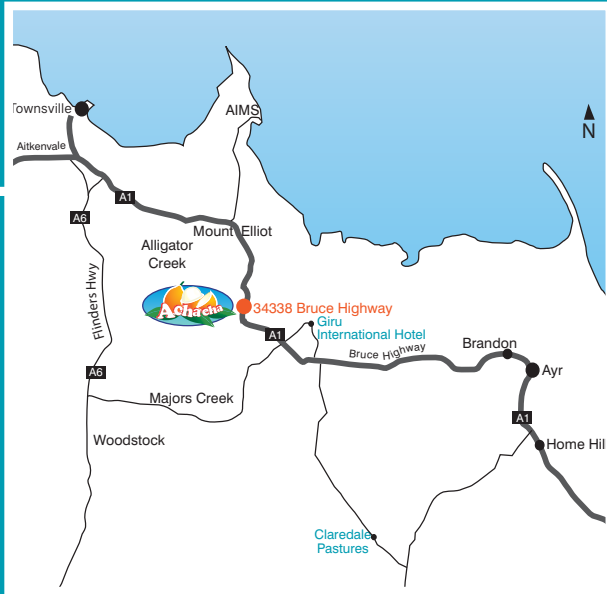

WHAT IS THE

Achacha

The Achacha, an egg-shaped tropical fruit originally from the Amazon Basin, is now grown in North Queensland. On 101ha, the plantation supplies the Australian and international markets. The season is normally December/January to March/April. Taste experts describe the flavour as “sweet, tangy, refreshing – like a sorbet”. A nutritious drink can be made from the skin.
