

WHAT IS THE



The Achacha, an egg-shaped tropical fruit originally from the Amazon Basin, is now grown in North Queensland. On 101ha, the plantation supplies the Australian and international markets. The season is normally December/January to March/April. Taste experts describe the flavour as "sweet, tangy, refreshing – like a sorbet". A nutritious drink can be made from the skin.





The plantation is Certified Organic, using regenerative agriculture practices. Join us to see some Australian innovations including two Flowhives with observation windows to show





bees at work and facilitate the collection of honey, a Flow Form used with biodynamic inputs for the trees, and a small state of the art Solar Powered Chicken Caravan.

And we have lots of trees. There are approximately 15,000 Achacha trees, 2,500 African mahogany windbreak trees, plus mangoes, soursops, jackfruit, coconuts, star apples, star fruit and other exotics. And wallabies, kangaroos and birds!
